# Why Are We Here?



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## **VCCHIC Mission**

The mission of the Ventura County Community Health Improvement Collaborative (VCCHIC) is to build partnerships to improve population health outcomes in Ventura County. These partnerships are necessary to accomplish the shared vision of working collaboratively to develop strategies based on the identified health priorities from the community health needs assessment. This will result in a collective approach to community building and organizing for health.

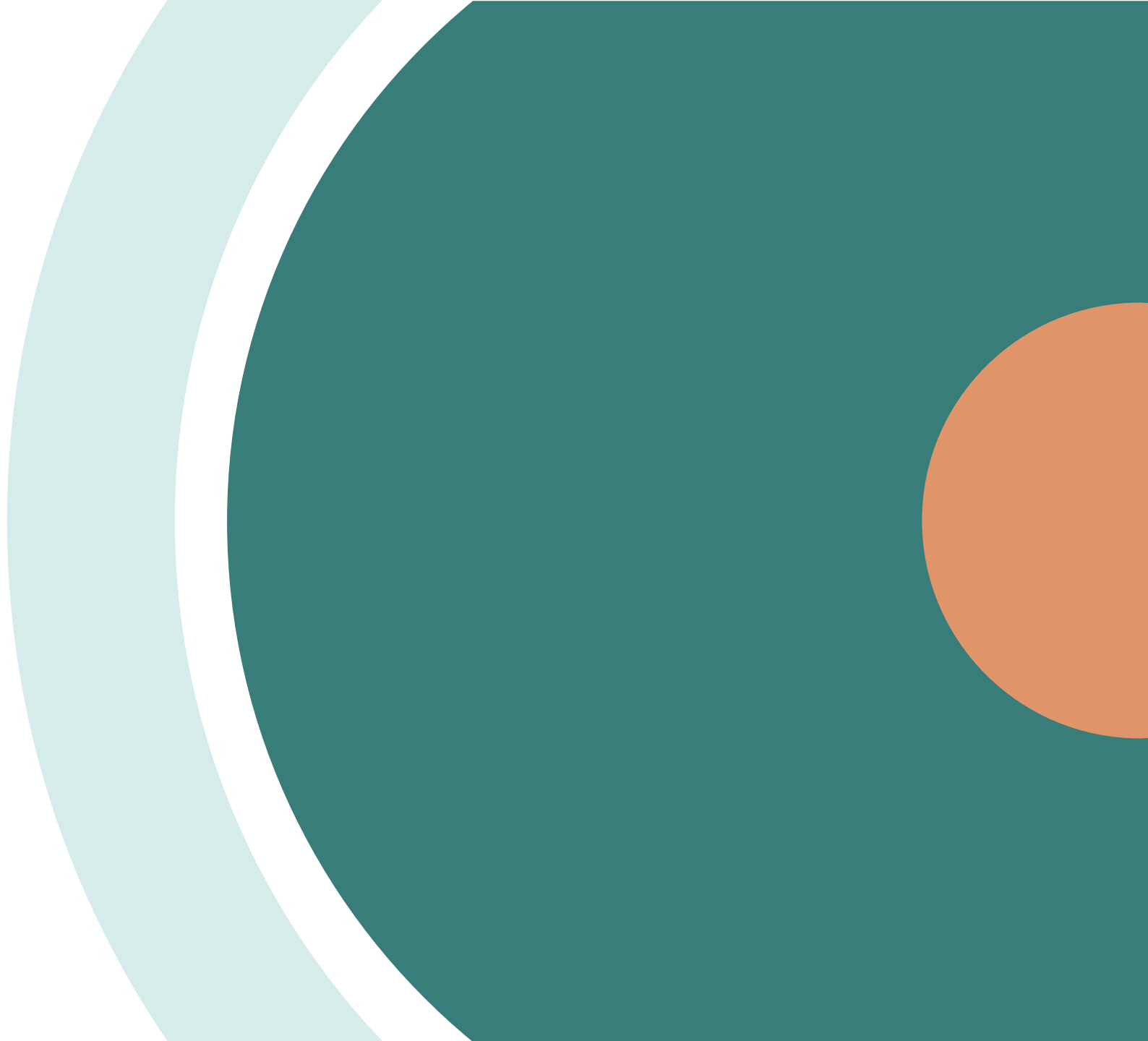

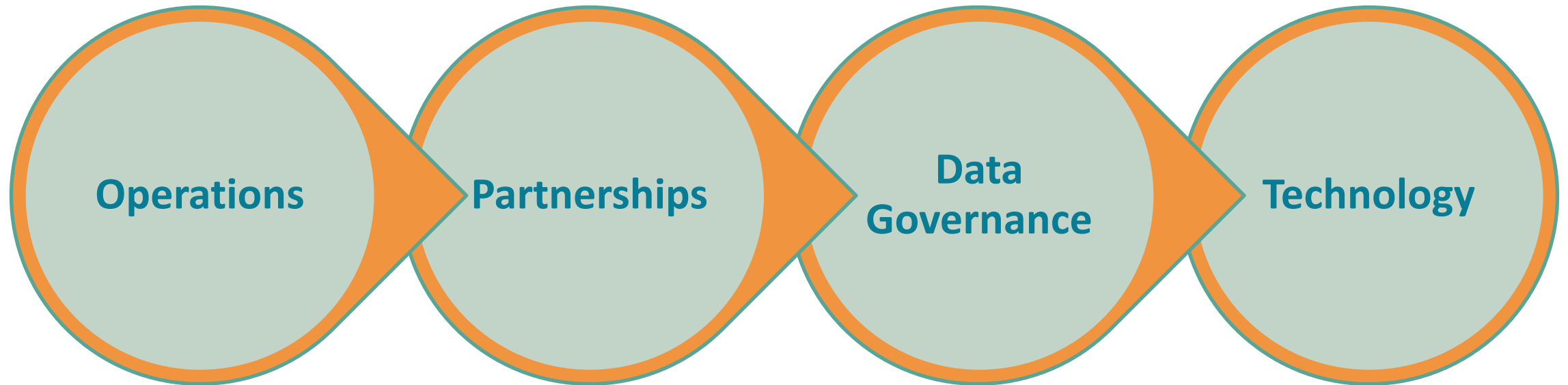

- Building the System & Integration Strategy

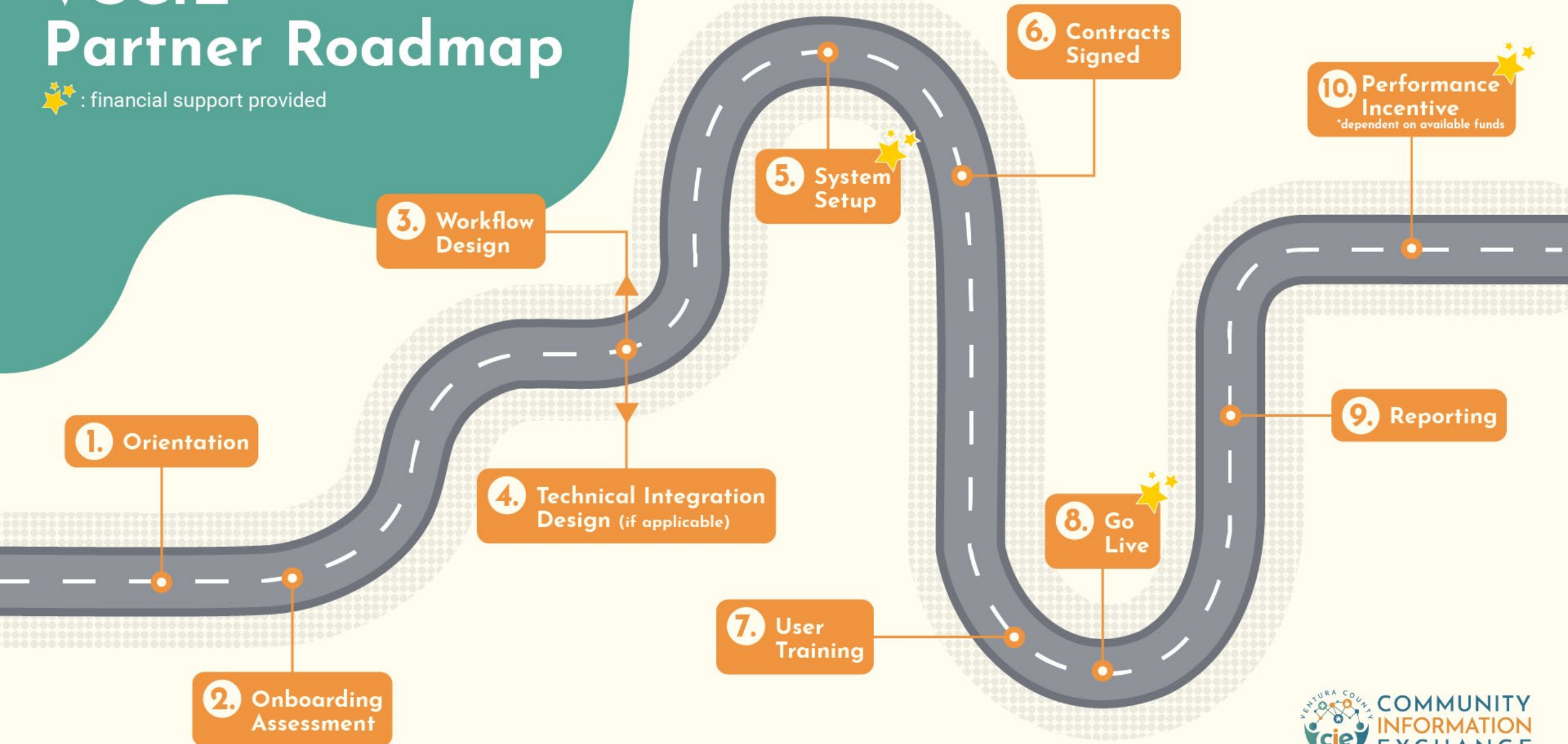
# Three Key Programmatic Foci

- School Behavioral Health Incentive Program (SBHIP):
  - Rio & Hueneme School Districts
  - Three design sessions completed resulting in an in depth BRD
  - Service partner outreach and onboarding in process
- Gold Coast Health Plan
  - Design sessions underway to determine additional system requirements
- Aging Population: Partnership with SCAN and USAging
  - Technical Assistance cohort has four organizations signed on; applications open until end of February to get 2-4 more

# System

- Initial system configuration (all baseline and SBHIP focused requirements) to be completed by the end of February
  - Additional iterations of configuration are determined in the BRD and will continue to build upon initial set
  - Additional functionality that requires code is also determined and will be added to the system as it is ready
- Integration discussions with key partners in progress (Cerner, school districts, Visionlink)
- Working with Visionlink to establish system architecture and to determine an EMPI solution
